## Call for Concurrent Programs

- Providing accurate information for any and all co-presenters;

- Presenters will be responsible for supplying all display materials and handouts;

- Scheduling conflicts may occur and may not be resolved if all co-presenters are not submitted to the Conference Committee in a timely manner;

Program proposals will be reviewed by the following criteria:

- Abstract, description and learning objectives are clearly articulated;

- Abstract and description are clearly related;

- Proposals should focus on the content of the presentation, conference theme relevancy and the purpose and goals of ASCA

The Programming committee is committed to providing diverse and quality programs that will lead to a successful professional development opportunity for all attendees. Click


